Remembrance Services for the Centenary of the Great War

"Throughout the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth, as the centenary of the First World War approached, Services of Commemoration and Remembrance were prepared. At All Saints' Services would be held to commemorate the 100th anniversary of each of those twenty-eight servicemen from the village, engraved on the Shillington War Memorial, who made the ultimate sacrifice in the Great War. The first service was attended by Sir Samuel Whitbread, Her Majesty's Lord-Lieutenant of Bedfordshire accompanied by the Deputy Lieutenant."

"Each individual service was held in the Lady Chapel, conducted by the Rector, Reverend Richard Winslade, accompanied by the full church choir, to commemorate each man, in many cases attended by present day members of his own family, and making an appropriate reading from the Scriptures.

In one case a family came over specially from Australia to attend their ancestor's service."

wo candles flickered in the darkness in Shillington's parish church on Tuesday evening to mark the centenary of the deaths of the first villagers to fall in the First World War.

The polignant tribute featured in a service held at All Saints Church to remember the first two men from the village who lost their lives fighting for their country. But the glowing candles were lit in memory of Private Harry Ansell and Private Arthur Pearce, both of the Ist Battalion of the Bedfordshire Regiment.

Pte Ansell died on November 7, 1914 aged 21, and his name is inscribed on the Le Touret memorial in Pas de Calais.

It is believed that Pte Pearce was killed in action in the same area two days later.

Tuesday's ceremony was the first of a series of services which will be held over four years to remember each man who died from

of a series of services which will be held over four years to remember each man who died from Shillington, on the centenary of their sacrifice. They have been organised by John Catton, a former serviceman from the Buffs (Royal East Kent Regiment), and the Rev Richard

Winslade.

Mr Catton said: "I think it is a very good idea and everyone I have spoken to has been very enthusiastic about it.

"It is important to remember the men—who are all listed on Shillington's war memorial—who lost their lives.




